FROM THE PASTOR....

Brothers and Sisters,

Every month we begin our session meetings with a time of study. In the month of March we were guided in a discussion about the church-What is the church? What do you think when you hear the world church?

Many people, both in- and outside of the church think only of that building on 12th between Jackson and Main when they hear the word church. For people who have spent time with this congregation, the sanctuary of the building comes to mind when church is mentioned, or they think of the chapel, or the youth room, or even the daycare. There was an elder in our session meeting who commented that the church is not a building: those four walls just provide a wonderful place to gather. This elder went on to say that the Auburn Presbyterian Church is really the people. The people are the church and the church is the people.

We learned that the Greek word for church is *ekklesia*, which means "assembly" or "called out of." This is the way the church is referred to in numerous spots in the New Testament, which clearly identifies the church with the people and not any kind of building. The Apostle Paul developed this idea more fully and church has come to mean an assembly that includes all of those, living, dead, and yet to come who believe in Jesus Christ.

The part about church that I wanted to bring to your attention in this little writing deals with the "called out of" part. By virtue of a belief in Jesus as our savior we are differentiated from those who don't-we are "called out of" the general population. The Bible refers to this as being salt or yeast, change agents, in the larger world. This is to say that we see the world a little bit differently than others and we have a different set of priorities. Based on our belief in Christ, we live out these priorities and this difference-we strive to live as those who are "called out of."

Sometimes, living as disciples and part of the church is really hard. Not too many of us want to stand out in a crowd in a way that calls attention to our faith. The world thinks of peace, love, humility, and justice as weak, but that is the life to which a belief in Christ calls us. We are not all gifted to be evangelists preaching the word and I'm reminded of a quote that's attributed to St. Francis, "Preach Jesus and, if necessary, use words". We offer our testimony as we live in ways that run contrary to the world. Not easy work.

The other element in the meaning of *ekklesia* involves assembly-church is a group and, as part of this assembly, we do not have to go it alone. The church is made up of people, but people who are in relationship with each other, supporting and encouraging each other. Because living as an alternative community in the world is hard work, we help each other in this task.

Friends, we are called to be the church. We are set apart as God's instrument in the world. Not only on Sundays, but everyday we have the task of preaching the risen Christ through word and deed.
