

APC is like...

Lately, I've been asking people about what they think the church is. More specifically, I've been asking people what they think Auburn Presbyterian is. That's a big question and, when I ask, most people struggle to answer so I figured out a different approach...If Auburn Presbyterian Church were a television show, what show would it be? Similarly, if APC were a car, what kind of car would it be?

I have had some really great conversations around these questions. One person said they felt the church was like the bar in the old show Cheers-everyone knows your name (and everyone has their seat). Another person mentioned that they saw a lot of parallels between the Auburn car and the church-it was innovative in its time. The variety of responses to those questions have been surprising. It seems like the church touches each of us differently. What do you think?

I'm asking these questions to get a better idea of who we are, what we do, and why we do it. The church is so much more than just a place where we gather for worship. We have a nice mission statement that you can find on our web site (<u>www.auburnpc.org</u>), but that statement falls short in attempting to say who we are. There is no way to capture the depth and richness of this congregation by describing just one of our practices or offering a few sentences-even a book would necessarily have to omit some things. More than that, every church has those unwritten rules and informal history that doesn't make it into books or on the web site, and that "institutional history" paints a truer picture of APC than what is available for public consumption.

Also, right now I have fresh eyes. I can see those things that those of you who have been here for awhile have stopped seeing. What will happen is that, after time, I will get drawn into the APC system and my perspective will change. The fresh eyes I have right now will soon lose a portion of their discernment. Since I know this vision will soon slip away as I become more and more a part of the church, now is the time to take advantage of my perspective.

It is really, really fun for me to talk with people and hear them share the different ways the church has been meaningful for them. I've heard stories about how God worked with the church that brought tears to my eye and others that just make me shake my head. The thing is, I've only scratched the surface because you are a deep and rich congregation.

If something occurs to you that you really want to share, call or shoot me an email. Otherwise, just wait. I've made a commitment to spend time outside of worship with all the members of this church. Sorry if I haven't gotten to you yet, but your time is coming. I say that because each of you has something to add to the description of what APC is and what it does and I really want to hear that something.

On April 15, 2018, the Reverend David Lawrence was installed as Pastor of the Auburn Presbyterian Church. Members and friends of our church, along with many members of the Wabash Valley Presbytery, gathered in our sanctuary for the installation service.

The Rev. Quincy Worthington, pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Munster and vice-moderator of the Wabash Valley Presbytery, welcomed all in attendance at the 3:00 PM service. Others participating in the installation were: the Rev. David Westphal, honorably retired from the ELCA; David's son Ross Lawrence, an elder at the First Presbyterian Church in Niles, Michigan; the Rev. Fran Lane-Lawrence, pastor at the Niles church (and David's wife!); the Rev. Jennifer Burns Lewis, Visioning and Connecting Leader of the Wabash Valley Presbytery; Clerk of Session at Auburn Presbyterian, Kay Finchum; Auburn Presbyterian Elder Julia Nixon; the Rev.
