FROM THE PASTOR:

Brothers and Sisters-During this last year we have explored the meaning behind the church calendar, the changing colors of the paraments and my stoles, and the significance of special Sundays throughout the year. I think this is interesting and I hope you do, too.

These are practices and traditions of the larger Church and when we intentionally participate in these traditions we are drawn more deeply into the larger community of faith. It's really sort of fascinating to think that we are not alone in these practices. We share them with both the church on the other side of town and the church on the other side of the world. We are part of a much larger movement than it seems when we look around our sanctuary.

I think many people are aware of the Scriptures in John, Corinthians, Philippians, and Ephesians that say we are in but not of this world. This means we are joined with the church as part of the great circle of faith, but we are also different from the rest of the world in several ways. This difference includes our practice of telling time. We have different seasons in the church and our days carry much different meaning than the world in which we live. As people of faith we orient our days around the risen Lord.

There are deep Biblical and theological meanings to nearly everything about the church—from the architecture to our actions—and that includes our calendar. We might have always done it that way, but there is a reason. A deeper understanding of the "why" we do things and the rationale behind it adds understanding to our faith.

Moving ahead, we are going to take some steps designed to explain some of the meanings behind the things we do, which will shed light on our faith. One of these steps is a shift in the days we celebrate communion. For at least the next year we are going to celebrate communion on Sundays that are liturgically significant. This is a change that makes us more aware of the church calendar and enhances our awareness of Jesus' life and ministry.

This still works out to be monthly communion, but we are not going to always celebrate that sacrament on the first Sunday of the month. For example, in February and March we will have communion on the first Sunday because there are no significant Sundays in those months. Then, in April we will have two communions—one for Palm Sunday and one for Easter. As you can see, our communion will be linked with significant events in the church year and in the flow of the lectionary.

Together with the Worship and Music Committee we will explore what is liturgically significant about the Sundays on which we have communion. I will work to remind you about our place in the larger Church and how our common practices unite us with Christians throughout the world. Not only are we reviving a tradition, but we are also affirming our connectional nature with the larger church and being aware of how the gospel influences our lives.

## ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

That day we take people on a walking tour of our building – an art/architectural tour to celebrate our church's  $175^{\text{th}}$  anniversary.

Feb. 3: Ministry, Social Justice and a New Generation of Leaders. Join us as we welcome Zach Heimach, a recent graduate of Louisville (Presbyterian Theological) Seminary. Zach, who grew up in our church, will share his thoughts about how the church at large can best speak to millennials on issues they care about, especially issues relating social justice.
