Sisters and Brothers-


I am having more and more conversations touching on the change that's going on around us. What is striking me about these conversations is the common theme of how things are coming apart. These conversations are about more than church – we see this coming apart in clubs, activities, how people gather, and in so many other facets of life. It seems like the very fabric of society is unraveling before our eyes.

The church isn't exempt from this unraveling. We are witnessing churches and denominations both implode and dwindle right in front of us. And we hate to see it. We know how much the church means to us, how influential it is in our lives, and what a force for good it can be. It's heartbreaking to watch this great institution come apart and we want to do something to affect the situation.

The session and I are not blind to the challenges facing APC. We want to take steps to bring life to our congregation. Already we have pivoted our mission to Ukraine. We have started taking on smaller mission works. We have taken steps to be a part of our community. There is no single solution or miraculous program that will change our course. Instead, we are experimenting with all these little things to gradually have an impact on the congregation. This is our attempt to bring light to the darkness that surrounds us.

My doctoral dissertation concluded that if the church is going to continue in the 21st century it's going to have to do some things differently. That may seem like a "no brainer", but the challenge is determining what those things are. How can we discern God's calling of APC? We would like instant gratification and an easy answer, but life doesn't work that way. The process of bringing life to APC is painstakingly slow and laborious. Just as the Israelites toiled through the wilderness, we are striving to chart our own path to the promised land.
