

Thursday, June 15, 2023: Quilt Garden Tour, Day Trip



Join us Thursday, June 15th for a day trip to Das Dutchman Essenhaus in Middlebury, IN to see its gigantic, almost 3,000 square foot quilt inspired garden. The day includes stops at various quilt gardens along the way, ending with lunch and shopping at Das Dutchman Essenhaus.

Six (6) congregations are participating and we hope to fill two (2) buses, each bus holds fourteen (14) passengers and has one (1) driver. There will be an Auburn/Garrett bus and a Chapel/LaGrange bus. If needed, we will secure an additional bus. The buses will leave from Garrett and Chapel at 9:00 am respectively and pick up at Auburn and LaGrange on the way. Expect to be back about 3:00 p.m.

Cost for participants is \$15.00 each, which includes bus trip, lunch and possible buggy ride at Das Essenhaus if weather permits. Sign up deadline is June 11th.

Brothers and Sisters:

This week I was emailing some friends of mine in Mexico. A few years ago I regularly traveled to Mexico two or three times a year in service of the church. My presbytery had a relationship with a presbytery in Mexico, the church I was serving had a sister relationship with a church in Nuevo Leon Presbytery, and we would go there every year for mission work. I was shaped by that ministry and value those memories, however, things changed.

I know that APC has ties with Roca Firme Church in Mexico and that mission was very influential for some members of our congregation. Some of you traveled there several times and speak lovingly about the experiences. John and Linda worked to keep that relationship in the forefront and encouraged our congregation in that direction, but things changed.

On a larger scale, our denominations, the PC(USA) and the NPCM have dissolved formal relations. While the Auburn congregation still values our relationship with Roca Firme, life has intruded. We got older and our abilities and responsibilities have evolved. The Auburn church moved away from the mission to Mexico as I have.

Our Mission Committee is now directing us to different mission work that seems to fit better. As a congregation, we are participating in short-term mission work that has been well-received and effective. We collected over 50 school bags and just completed an enormous number of hygiene kits. On top of that, the Presbyterian Women put together "period packs" that are gender-specific kits for women. So many of you took part in this mission work! Today I took the collection of hygiene kits to Elkhart and dropped them off. The folks at Church World Service were impressed!

Another new mission for us is the Little Free Food Pantry. I was in my office yesterday afternoon and watched a steady flow of people come to our little pantry. It seems like stuff disappears as soon as we stock it. This great mission is staffed by just a few people and I think they would welcome some help. More than help filling the cupboard, I think we would appreciate the donation of food for the pantry. I wonder if some of us could make this a regular part of our shopping when we go to Krogers.

We did some great mission work abroad. Those were special experiences and relationships. We can look back on that work and consider it well done, but that's not the end. We mourn the loss of what we used to do, but we have replaced it with work that's just as valid. We continue to impact the world through Church World Services. We are touching our local community in new ways. Best of all, many people in the congregation are taking part in this mission work.
