#### Brothers and Sisters -

Right now we find ourselves in the middle of Lent. These 40 days are more significant for some people than they are for others. For me, this season of the church calendar has always been especially meaningful. I don't always give up or take on a spiritual practice, but I am a little more introspective during this time.

Lent stands out because of the number of special services we have. From Ash Wednesday to Good Friday, a lot of my time and energy is spent curating those services. In fact, I just finished a rough draft for the special Maundy Thursday service. I know it's a strange name and I'm usually asked at least once a year what Maundy means and why this worship is so special.

Maundy comes from the Latin *mandatum* or mandate. Maundy Thursday service revolves around a couple of scriptures in which Jesus tells his disciples to "do this". Jesus says that about foot washing – as I have done for you so you should do for one another. He also says "Do this in remembrance of me" when he celebrates the last supper. This mandate/command informs Maundy Thursday and, really, all of Lent…caring and remembering.

We particularly mark off the days of Lent on the calendar, but I hope Jesus' mandate shapes your whole life of faith. Remember Jesus and care for one another every day, not just during the season of Lent.

Sign-up sheets will be posted in the Narthex for registration. All are welcome and we will open the classes to the community. Since space for each class is limited, be sure to save your spot early!


## MISSION ACTION AND INTREPRETATION NEWS
